








#### Classroom News from our P2, P5 & P6 classes:

#### **Important Reminders**

\*\*Please ensure that pets are <u>not</u> brought to the school playground or at any drop-off/pick-up locations around the school.\*\*

Children's safety is our top priority, and pets can be unpredictable around children.

### **Bikes in School**

We encourage children to travel to school by bicycle, but <u>children must come off their bikes</u> <u>at the school gates</u> and walk carefully and sensibly to the bike shed to park and secure their bikes. All children have been advised of this at school assemblies with all staff re-enforcing this important message to all.

Please ensure that bikes and scooters are taken home at the end of each day, as we have unfortunately had some bikes stolen and damaged recently. Please also ensure that locks are secured before leaving any bikes or scooters unattended.

#### **Mobile Phones**

If pupils are bringing mobile phones to school, they **must be switched off before entering the school building** and placed safely with the class teacher in the classroom. These **will be returned at the end of the school day** where children can switch them back on when they leave the school playground. If you need to be in touch with your child(ren) during the school day, please contact the school office.













**All parents/carers** please ensure that your child(ren) **do not bring** any of the following food items to school as they can present serious hazards to themselves and/or others:

Lollipops with stick attached

Nuts of any kind (we have a growing number of children with nut allergies and any contact can have extremely serious consequences)

Any form of Nutella products (as they contain nuts)

Please be mindful of the following if these are brought to school:

Cereal bars (as they can contain nuts – please check the nutrition information)

Small tomatoes & grapes – Recent guidance from our Early Years team has advised that small tomatoes and grapes should be cut in quarters rather than halves, as when halved they can still pose a risk. Please ensure these are cut into small pieces, as these can be serious choking hazards for children if not cut.

Further to this, many parents/carers are donating food items such as cakes and sweets as part of birthday celebrations. We respectfully ask that <u>no</u> food items are handed in to school due to the amount of pupils who experience food allergies.

Please ensure that **no fizzy juice** is given for packed lunch and please have **water only in class water bottles.** 

#### Parking:

Please note that the school car park is designated for staff parking only. The school campus does not have a large enough car park to accommodate parking for parents/carers.

The car park cannot be used for dropping pupils off or picking pupils up from Out of School Clubs either. Children use the footpath leading through the staff car park to access classrooms, this is not a public area.
